

- Understand the anatomical considerations of the maxillary sinus, including vascular supply, membrane integrity, and variations that impact sinus lift procedures.
- Identify appropriate case selection criteria through comprehensive clinical examination and radiographic assessment, including CBCT evaluation.
- Analyze treatment planning options for simultaneous implant placement with sinus elevation and bone grafting based on residual bone height and quality.
- Determine the appropriate surgical approach (lateral window or crestal technique), grafting materials, and implant selection to achieve primary stability and predictable outcomes.


